Privacy Notice on the Processing of Personal Data in Camera Surveillance

The purpose of this notice is to inform you about how we process personal data recorded by camera surveillance. We take seriously our obligation to comply with the EU General Data Protection Regulation as well as other applicable legislation concerning the processing of personal data. We also ensure that processing is secure and that our data protection practices enable the full realization of data subjects' rights.

2 What Personal Data Is Processed, for what purpose and what is the legal basis?

We process video and image material of persons moving within the camera surveillance area. The image material also records the date and time of events. Camera surveillance is in place in Arinatie 10-12, 00370, Helsinki Finland and Takkatie 19, 00370, Helsinki, Finland.

The purpose of camera surveillance is to protect property, prevent vandalism and crimes, and assist in the investigation of crimes that have already occurred as well as situations that endanger property and safety. In addition, the purpose of surveillance is to ensure the safety of persons moving in the area and the premises.

The processing of personal data is based on our legitimate interest to ensure the security of our premises and to protect property. Camera surveillance is indicated by signs and stickers in the areas where camera surveillance is in place.

3 To Whom Do We Disclose Personal Data?

As a general rule, we do not disclose personal data to external parties. However, data may be disclosed to police or other authorities for criminal investigation purposes when necessary in connection with the investigation, or to legal service providers.

We use subcontractors acting on our behalf in the processing of personal data. We use software provided by a third party and we have outsourced security services from a service provider.

4 General Description of Technical and Organizational Safeguards and Transfers

Only those of our employees or our service providers' employees who are entitled to process surveillance data as part of their work are authorized to use the system containing personal data. We have signed data processing agreements with service providers, in which they have committed to comply with the data protection and data security requirements of the Data Protection Regulation.

Databases containing personal data are protected by passwords and access levels. The data is located in an environment protected by appropriate data security software, physical and technical arrangements.

We do not transfer camera surveillance material outside European Union / European Economic Area.

5 How Long Do We Store the Data?

Personal data is retained for as long as necessary to fulfill the purpose of camera surveillance. As a general rule, recordings can be processed retrospectively for 1.5 months, after which they are deleted. Personal data may be retained longer if this is necessary for a specific reason, such as suspected crimes and related official investigations.

We regularly assess the necessity of retaining data, taking into account applicable legislation. In addition, we take reasonable measures to ensure that personal data that is incompatible with the purposes of processing, outdated or inaccurate is not retained about data subjects. We rectify or delete such data without delay.

6 Rights of the Data Subject

Right	In what situations
To access data stored about oneself	Always
To request rectification of inaccurate or outdated data	Always
To request erasure of data	When any of the conditions under Article 17 of the Data Protection Regulation are met
To object to the processing of data	When the processing of data is based on legitimate interest and there is a specific personal situation
To request restriction of processing (e.g., for the time it takes to investigate and resolve requests concerning the data)	If the accuracy of the data is contested or any other condition under Article 18 of the Data Protection Regulation is met
To lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Ombudsman regarding the processing of personal data	Always

Please note that not all of the above rights are applicable in every situation. The EU General Data Protection Regulation and possibly other local legislation set out specific conditions under which these rights may be exercised, and in certain circumstances, we may be entitled or required to limit or refuse a request in accordance with applicable law.

We will respond to requests and inquiries from data subjects regarding the exercise of data subject rights within one month.
